ADVANCE Ministry Preparation

COURSE DESCRIPTION

A study of child development with implications for religious instruction. Organizations for children in grades 1-6 will be studied.

- 2. Demonstrate the ability to create, maintain, and grow a developmentally appropriate Christian children's program.
- 3. Assess and develop the vision and mission of the church for the Children's Ministry.
- 4. Evaluate the children's program in a church based on the criteria learned in the course.
- 5. Build consensus and ongoing support for the church's Ministry to Children.

The student will be expected to understand and apply the following content and process skills within the course content:

- Developmentally appropriate practices and environment for Children's Ministry
- Strategies to assess, create, and extend the quality of the church's vision/mission for the Children's Program.
- Role(s) of the Children's Ministry Directory (volunteer or paid)
- The value of Inter-Generational Contexts
- Evaluate the Children's Ministry Program provided in a church.

The student will be expected to develop a conceptual framework for:

- Children's Family/Church Ministry
- Developmentally Appropriate Environments and Practices
- Curriculum Development/Selection
- Teaching/Learning Styles and Strategies

REQUIRED CLASS PRODUCTS

- 1. Students will research and compile the characteristics of children, the needs that arise from these characteristics, and the implications these characteristics and needs have for the Children's Ministry Program. Characteristics will include: physical, developmental, mental, social, emotional, stylistic, and spiritual. Students will complete this assignment in teams to focus on a particular age group (1-2, 3-4, 5-6). Information will be presented in class to enable each student to receive information for each grade level group. More details on this project will be given in class.
- 2. Critique a church's yearly schedule for the Children's Ministry curriculum plans and special programs, parties, inter-generational activities, retreats, etc. that are promoted throughout the year. More details will be given in class.
- 3. Evaluate the Children's Ministry in a specific church and write implications for ministry based on their findings. More details will be given in class

Rubric for grading will be developed/articulated during the first class session.
